- Large berry
- Very Firm with excellent quality
- Great cold storage



'Patriot'

- Half high cross
- Winter Hardy
- Large fruit
- Very productive as a young bush
- Early bloomer
 Soft fruit if left too long on bush
 Virus issues.



'Bluejay'

- #1 variety for machine harvested for fresh market
- Fruit is firm, round and has a loose clusters.
- Large bush
- Vigorous grower



Northland

- MSU release in 1950's
- Selected for the U.P. in Michigan
- Cold hardy
- Very productive
- Used for processing in MI

'Spartan'

- Large fruit
- Good production
- Site specific
- Great variety if you can grow it

- 'Bluecrop'
- 'Blueray'
- 'Draper'
- Toro



Mid Season 'Bluecrop'

#1 planted variety in the world

High productivity

 Large excellent quality fruit for fresh market sale



'Blueray'

- Sister seedling to 'Bluecrop'
- High productivity
- Very winter hardy
- Good grower
- Needs to be handpicked the first picking



'Toro'

- Ripens with 'Bluecrop'
- Large firm fruit
- Shorter stockier bush
- More erect with fruit load
- Appears to be very hardy



Draper MSU release

- Ripens with Bluecrop
- Excellent Berry
- Very firm Crisp
- Long term storage in cooler.

- Cross of 'Bluehaven'
- Small rounded bush
- Very productive
- Medium size, high quality fruit
- Early blooming

- 'Elliott' X 'Brigitta'
- Late season with 'Elliott'
- Excellent berry quality fruit
- Good production
- Winter hardy
- Good cold storage
- Mechanical harvest for fresh fruit

'Liberty'

- MSU release Fall 2003
- 'Elliott' X 'Brigitta'
- Ripens 5 days before 'Elliott'
- Excellent fruit quality
- Excellent cold storage
- Upright bush
- Mechanical Harvest for fresh frit

'Draper'

- MSU release Fall 2003
- Cross Duke X G751
- Ripens with 'Bluecrop'
- Excellent fruit quality
- Great potentialReplacement for Bluecrop

'Huron' (MSU-47)

- MSU release in 2009
- Early Mid-Season ripening with Patroit
- 85% Highbush, 12% Southern, 3% Lowbush
- Excellent yields, fruit quality and flavor, winter hardiness

'Superior'

- Univ. Minnesota release 2009
- Half High bush for USDA Zone 3-4
- Mid- late season ripening
- Good productivity
- Extends picking season for Northern Growers in Zones 3-4
